About the Niskayuna

Central School District

Niskayuna is a vibrant, suburban school district with five neighborhood elementary schools, two middle schools and one high school.

Yesterday

The Niskayuna Central School District was founded by citizens who wanted to ensure a high quality education for the community's children. It was centralized in 1953, and became known for educational excellence across the region and beyond.

In 1983, Niskayuna High School was among the first schools to be recognized through the federal "Schools of Excellence" program at a White House ceremony.



In 2006, voters approved a nearly \$95 million building renovation and expansion project that provided a much-needed update to school facilities and incorporated energy-efficient infrastructure, as well as security and technology improvements.



Today

Teachers, support staff, families, community members, administrators and board members work to prepare students for future success, putting opportunities for them at the heart of decision-making.

A rigorous academic program at all levels culminates at the high school, where students have access to Advanced Placement, honors, and college-credit bearing courses. Community support has sustained exceptional programs in all areas, including world languages, music and art, and athletic and extracurricular activities.

The district's strategic plan calls for ongoing review of academic programs, ensuring that curriculum and instructional practices are regularly updated so students are prepared for an ever-changing world. In recent years, investing in social-emotional learning and support and involving

A lifelong learner who can work with the board of education and the school community to pursue educational excellence while understanding how decisions affect students, teachers and learning, and the capacity for innovation.

INTEGRITY:

Possess and demonstrate honesty, good judgment, high moral standards and a

respectful and caring demeanor, so that others will know that their efforts, ideas, work and perspectives are valued and essential to the healthy operations of the district.

EXPERIENCED:

Classroom, building-level and central office leadership experience in the areas of curriculum and instruction, diversity, equity and inclusion, social-emotional learning and educational technology. Niskayuna is an active suburban community with approximately 23,000 residents. While essentially a residential community, it is home to major employers, including General Electric Global Research Center, Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory, Environment One, and SI Group.

General Electric, New York State agencies, hospitals and health care providers, high-tech businesses and numerous colleges and universities are also major employers in the region, with the institutes of higher education providing educational, cultural and recreational opportunities as well. Many civic groups enhance the larger community and address the needs its diverse population.

Both Niskayuna and the neighboring city of Schenectady host weekly farmers' markets and Schenectady is home to a growing number of culinary and entertainment options. Geographic Location

The Niskayuna Central School District is located in New York's Capital Region, about 20 miles from the City of Albany.

The district covers 20 square miles. Approximately 80 percent of the district is in the Town of Niskayuna in Schenectady County. The remaining portions of the district are in the Town of Glenville (Schenectady County), the Town of Clifton Park (Saratoga County), and the Town of Colonie (Albany County).

The district borders the City of Schenectady to the west, and the Mohawk River to the north and east, where a beautiful stretch of the Mohawk-Hudson Bikeway provides a popular biking and walking trail. This is part of the Erie Canalway Trail that runs from Buffalo to Albany.
