


What's on the ballot May 17?

- Proposed \$99,853,607 budget for 2022-23

 Tax levy increase of 2.87% at the cap
- Bus purchase proposition
 7 vehicles at a cost not to exceed \$970,000
- Board of Education election

 Four candidates for three seats for three-year terms beginning July 2, 2022



Budget At-a-glance

Revenue

- Tax levy increase of 2.87% at the district's cap
- State aid increase of \$5.1 million
 - Includes continued phase-in of Foundation Aid due to the district

Expenditures

- Budget total: \$99,853,067
 - Continues all current student programs and services
 - Funds staff additions that are critical to meeting student and operational needs
 - Allows the district to bring back some positions that were reduced in prior years

Increasing Direct Student Support

Elementary Instruction

- A special education teacher to meet student needs (1 FTE)
- An additional, full-time school social worker (1 FTE)
- OT/Speech/PT (1.2 FTE)
- English as a New Language (0.2 FTE)
- Moving a teaching position currently funded by federal grants to the general fund for sustainability (1 FTE)
- Four additional teaching assistants
- Additional support staff to improve safety at arrival and dismissal times



Increasing Direct Student Support

Middle School Instruction

- Reading teacher (0.2 FTE)
- Math teacher (0.2 FTE)
- Three additional teaching assistants



Increasing Direct Student Support

High School Instruction

- Additional high school sections to meet enrollment needs and student interest across all core subject areas and electives. (2.95 FTE)
- Music accompanist (0.05 FTE)
- Girls' varsity golf coach



Addressing Priority Areas of Operations

- Funding for a director of human resources and clerical support for the Human Resources office
- Funding for a director of pupil personnel services
- Additional clerical support for the Business office



Estimated Tax Bill Impact

These are preliminary estimates that will change:

- They are based on current assessment levels and equalization rates.
- Assessment levels and equalization rates are finalized at the municipal and state level over the summer.
- The figures do not take into account any property tax exemptions homeowners receive.

Bus Purchase Proposition on May 17

- Proposed purchase of seven buses as part of the district's long-term replacement plan
 - Total amount not to exceed \$970,000
 - Replacement plan helps
 maintaining a safe and efficient bus
 fleet with a stable tax impact; Debt
 is retired as new purchases are
 made
 - Approximately 67% of bus purchase costs are reimbursed by state aid
