Welcome to the world of robots! An Ozobot is a small, educational robot designed to introduce children to coding concepts by allowing them to program its movements using color combinations drawn on paper. Students will also be introduced to basic, block coding skills using Ozoblockly to program the robot's movement and behaviors.

Using Sphero robots, kids learn how to code and control the robot's movement. Students will use tile combinations to create a programmable path for a Sphero to navigate, even travel through a story sequence or around the walls of a maze. Programmable robots help kids learn fundamental STEM concepts through play-based learning and educational STEAM activities. Students will also be working on 21st Century skills of collaboration, creativity, communication and critical thinking. Ozobots and Spheros allow students to explore infinite ways to create, learn, inspire, and have fun! It's a fun and easy way to learn basic programming skills.
